

Scripture:

But you, when you pray, go into your room, and when you have shut your door, pray to your Father who *is* in the secret *place*; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly.

Matthew 6:6 (NKJV)

Here's what I want you to do: Find a quiet, secluded place... Just be there as simply and honestly as you can manage. The focus will shift from you to God, and you will begin to sense his grace.

Matthew 6:6 (MSG)

Definitions:

"Room" (NKJV), "Closet" (KJV), and "Secluded place" (MSG) are from the Greek *TAMEION*.

TAMEION defined:

- 1. "Storage room for foodstuffs" (nourishment)
- 2. "Bed chamber" (intimacy)

Biblical Examples of a Place for Prayer

1. Abraham

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Early the next morning Abraham got up and returned to the place where he had stood before the LORD.

Abraham's Place:
2. Daniel
Scripture: But when Daniel learned that the law had been signed, he went home and knelt down as usual in his upstairs room He prayed three times a day, just as he had always done

3. Jesus
Scripture: Now in the morning, having risen a long while before daylight, He went out and departed to a solitary place; and there He prayed. Mark 1:35 (NKJV)
Jesus' Place: (Gethsemane)

The Gap Concept:

Establishing a Personal Place of Prayer

Scripture:

I looked for a man among them who would build up the wall and stand before me in the gap on behalf of the land so I would not have to destroy it, but I found none.

Ezekiel 22:30 (NIV)

Note: "stand before me on behalf of"
The Value of a Personal "Gap!" A. It's a place of Peter's rooftop encounter
Scripture:Peter went up on the housetop to pray and saw heaven opened Acts 10:9b, 11a (NKJV)
B. It's a place of David's "still waters" revelation
Scripture: The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters. He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake. Psalm 23:1-3 (NKJV)
C. It's a place of Paul's anti-anxiety prescription
Scripture: Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything Fix your thoughts on what is true and honorable and right. Think about things that are pure and

lovely and admirable. Think about things that are excellent

and worthy of praise.
