## **Five Qualities of Prayers That Prevail**

**Quality One:** \_\_\_\_\_ Prayer

### *Scripture:*

The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much. Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed earnestly that it would not rain; and it did not rain on the land for three years and six months. And he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth produced its fruit.

James 5:16b-18 (NKJV)

**Quality Two:** \_\_\_\_\_ Prayer

### *Scripture:*

Those who sow in tears shall reap in joy. He who continually goes forth weeping, bearing seed for sowing, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves *with him*.

**Quality Three:** \_\_\_\_\_ Prayer

**Scripture:**

Have mercy upon me, O God, According to Your lovingkindness; According to the multitude of Your tender mercies, Blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin... Create in me a clean heart, O God, And renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me away from Your presence, And do not take Your Holy Spirit from me... The sacrifices of God *are* a broken spirit, a broken and a contrite heart— These, O God, You will not despise.

**Quality Four:** \_\_\_\_\_ Prayer

**Scripture:**

Once after a sacrificial meal at Shiloh, Hannah got up and went to pray. Eli the priest was sitting at his customary place beside the entrance of the Tabernacle. Hannah was in deep anguish, crying bitterly as she prayed to the Lord. And she made this vow: “O Lord of Heaven’s Armies, if you will look upon my sorrow and answer my prayer and give me a son, then I will give him back to you. He will be yours for his entire lifetime, and as a sign that he has been dedicated to the Lord, his hair will never be cut.” As she was praying to the Lord, Eli watched her. Seeing her lips moving but hearing no sound, he thought she had been

**Quality Five:** \_\_\_\_\_ Prayer

### *Scripture:*

Oh, that You would rend the heavens! That You would come down! That the mountains might shake at Your presence—As fire burns brushwood, As fire causes water to boil—To make Your name known to Your adversaries, *That* the nations may tremble at Your presence! When You did awesome things for which we did not look, You came down, The mountains shook at Your presence.
