Foundational Scripture:

Scripture:

George Muller's Six Steps for Determining God's Will

- 1. I seek at the beginning to get my heart into such a state that it has no will of its own in regard to a certain matter.
- 2. Having done this, I do not leave the result to feeling or simple impression. If I do so, I make myself liable to great delusions.
- 3. I seek the will of the Spirit through, or in connection with, the Word of God.
- 4. Next I take into account providential circumstances. These often plainly indicate God's will in connection with His Word and Spirit.
- 5. I ask God in prayer to reveal His will to me aright.
- 6. Thus, through prayer to God, the study of the Word, and reflection, I come to a deliberate judgment according to the best of my ability and knowledge.

AFTERTHOUGHTS... PONDER AND PRAY

Ponder Points:

Discuss (or ponder) why God's Word is the primary key to the matter of hearing God's voice and receiving divine guidance. Share any instances you might recall of how God used Scripture to give you specific guidance or confirm a particular decision.

Prayer Points:

Quietly listen to God's "still, small voice," asking Him to reveal any issues He wants you to pray for; whether personal, local, national or even international. Then, open your Bible randomly to the Psalms and see if God might lead you to claim a specific passage regarding that need.
