1. Prayer Path

Revelations (A Journey to the Word)

Scripture:

By your words I can see where I'm going; they throw a beam of light on my dark path.

Psalm 119:105 (MSG)

Serve the Lord with gladness; Come before His presence with singing.

Psalm 100:2 (NKJV)

The Message Bible reads:

On your feet now—applaud God! Bring a gift of laughter, sing yourselves into his presence.

But as for me, I will sing about your power. Each morning I will sing with joy about your unfailing love. For you have been my refuge, a place of safety when I am in distress.

Psalm 59:16 (NLT)

Sing out your thanks to the LORD; sing praises to our God with a harp.

Psalm 147:7 (NLT)

No matter where I am, your teachings fill me with songs.

Psalm 119:54 (CEV)

I will praise you, Lord, for everyone to hear, and I will sing hymns to you in every nation.

Psalm 57:9 (CEV)

I will thank you, Lord, among all the people. I will sing your praises among the nations.

Psalm 57:9 (NLT)

Note: 41 of 150 psalms refer to singing praises. (Singing and related words such as song and music, etc., appear 358 times in the Bible.)

Scripture:

Speak to one another with psalms, hymns and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord.

Ephesians 5:19 (NIRV)

Let the message about Christ, in all its richness, fill your lives. Teach and counsel each other with all the wisdom he gives. Sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs to God with thankful hearts.

Colossians 3:16 (NLT)

The New International Reader's Version reads...

Let the message about Christ live among you like a rich treasure. Teach and correct one another wisely. Teach one another by singing psalms and hymns and songs from the Spirit. Sing to God with thanks in your hearts.

Early the next morning the army of Judah went out into the wilderness of Tekoa. On the way Jehoshaphat stopped and said, "Listen to me, all you people of Judah and Jerusalem!
