# The Supremacy of Christ and The University of the Word

An Axiom of Supremacy ax•i•om (âk'sē-om) n.

- 1. A self-evident or universally recognized truth; a maxim.
- 2. A self-evident principle or one that is accepted as true without proof...

# A Supreme Axiom...

All of God's Word is in all of Christ and all of Christ is in all of God's Word. Christ is the living Word. Christ is God! Therefore, to be saturated in God's Word is to be saturated in, with and through all of Christ.

# The Testimony of John the Apostle:

"In the beginning [before all time] was the Word [Christ], and the Word was with God, and the Word was God Himself. He was present originally with God. All things were made and came into existence through Him, and without Him was not even one thing made that has come into being."

# The Testimony of Saint Augustine:

"The one who has Christ has everything. The one who has everything except for Christ really has nothing. And the one who has Christ plus everything else does not have any more than the one who has Christ alone."

# The Testimony of Charles Spurgeon:

"From every text of Scripture there is a road to Christ. And my dear brother, your business is, when you get a text, to say, 'Now, what is the road to Christ?' I have never found a text that did not have a road to Christ in it."

# The Testimony of Timothy Keller:

"If we ever tell a particular Bible story without putting it into the overall main Bible story (about Christ) we actually change the meaning of the particular event for us. It becomes a moralistic exhortation to 'try harder' rather than a call to live by faith in the work of Christ. There is, in the end, only two ways to read the Bible: Is it basically about me or basically about Jesus?"

3 Primary Passage

<sup>19</sup>God was pleased to have all of himself live in Christ. <sup>20</sup>God was also pleased to bring everything on earth and in heaven back to himself through Christ. He did this by making peace through Christ's blood sacrificed on the cross.

<sup>21</sup>Once you were separated from God. The evil things you did showed your hostile attitude. <sup>22</sup>But now Christ has brought you back to God by dying in his physical body. He did this so that you could come into God's presence without sin, fault, or blame. <sup>23</sup>This is on the condition that you continue in faith without being moved from the solid foundation of the hope that the Good News contains. You've heard this Good News of which I, Paul, became a servant. It has been spread throughout all creation under heaven.

## Paul Describes His Work

<sup>24</sup>I am happy to suffer for you now. In my body I am completing whatever remains of Christ's sufferings. I am doing this on behalf of his body, the church. <sup>25</sup>I became a servant of the church when God gave me the work of telling you his entire message. <sup>26</sup>In the past God hid this mystery, but now he has revealed it to his people. <sup>27</sup>God wanted his people throughout the world to know the glorious riches of this mystery—which is Christ living in you, giving you the hope of glory.

<sup>28</sup>We spread the message about Christ as we instruct and teach everyone with all the wisdom there is. We want to present everyone as mature Christian people. <sup>29</sup>I work hard and struggle to do this while his mighty power works in me.

<sup>1</sup>I want you to know how hard I work for you, for the people of Laodicea, and for people I have never met. <sup>2</sup>Because they are united in love, I work so that they may be encouraged by all the riches that come from a complete understanding of Christ. He is the mystery of God. <sup>3</sup>God has hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge in Christ. <sup>4</sup>I say this so that no one will mislead you with arguments that merely sound good. <sup>5</sup>Although I'm absent from you physically, I'm with you in spirit. I'm happy to see how orderly you are and how firm your faith in Christ is.

<sup>6</sup>You received Christ Jesus the Lord, so continue to live as Christ's people. <sup>1</sup>Sink your roots in him and build on him. Be strengthened by the faith that you were taught, and overflow with thanksgiving.

# Beware of Requirements Invented by Humans

<sup>8</sup>Be careful not to let anyone rob you <code>\_of</code> this faith <code>\_</code> through a shallow and misleading philosophy. Such a person follows human traditions and the world's way of doing things rather than following Christ.

<sup>9</sup>All of God lives in Christ's body, <sup>10</sup>and God has made you complete in Christ, Christ is in charge of every ruler and authority. <sup>11</sup>In him you were also
