Principle 5 Primary Passage

Faith Directed People's Lives

¹Faith assures us of things we expect and convinces us of the existence of things we cannot see. 2God accepted our ancestors because of their faith.

³Faith convinces us that God created the world through his word. This means what can be seen was made by something that could not be seen.

⁴Faith led Abel to offer God a better sacrifice than Cain's sacrifice. Through his faith Abel received God's approval, since God accepted his sacrifices. Through his faith Abel still speaks, even though he is dead.

⁵Faith enabled Enoch to be taken instead of dying. No one could find him, because God had taken him. Scripture states that before Enoch was taken, God Matt. 6:29-31 was pleased with him. 6 No one can please God without faith. Whoever goes to Matt 8:9-11 God must believe that God exists and that he rewards those who seek him.

⁷Faith led Noah to listen when God warned him about the things in the future that he could not see. He obeyed God and built a ship to save his family. Through faith Noah condemned the world and received God's approval that Luke 7:8-10 comes through faith.

⁸Faith led Abraham to obey when God called him to go to a place that he Luke 12:27-28 would receive as an inheritance. Abraham left his own country without knowing Luke 17: 5-7 where he was going.

9 Faith led Abraham to live as a foreigner in the country that God had promised him. He lived in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who received the same Acts 3:15-17 promise from God. 10 Abraham was waiting for the city that God had designed Acts 14:8-10 and built, the city with permanent foundations.

11 Faith enabled Abraham to become a father, even though he was old and Sarah had never been able to have children. Abraham trusted that God would keep his promise. 12 Abraham was as good as dead. Yet, from this man came Rom. 1:16-18 descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the grains Rom 3:27of sand on the seashore.

13 All these people died having faith. They didn't receive the things that God Rom4: 15had promised them, but they saw these things coming in the distant future and Rom. 5:1-3 rejoiced. They acknowledged that they were living as strangers with no perma- Rom. 10:11-18 nent home on earth. 14 Those who say such things make it clear that they are looking for their own country. 15 If they had been thinking about the country that they had left, they could have found a way to go back. 16 Instead, these men were | Corin 16:12 longing for a better country—a heavenly country. That is why God is not Gal. 2.15-17 ashamed to be called their God. He has prepared a city for them.

When God tested Abraham, faith led him to offer his son Isaac. Abraham, the one who received the promises from God, was willing to offer his only son as a sacrifice. 18 God had said to him, "Through Isaac your descendants will carry on your name." 19 Abraham believed that God could bring Isaac back from the dead. Abraham did receive Isaac back from the dead in a figurative sense.

²⁰Faith led Isaac to bless Jacob and Esau.

²¹While Jacob was dying, faith led him to bless each of Joseph's sons. He leaned on the top of his staff and worshiped God.

22 While Joseph was dying, faith led him to speak about the Israelites leaving Egypt and give them instructions about burying his bones.

²³Faith led Moses' parents to hide him for three months after he was born. They did this because they saw that Moses was a beautiful baby and they were not afraid to disobey the king's order.

Talk Back Time: (Share what you've learned with your small group.) Why do you think laughter (or a "merry heart") can affect our physical bodies like a medicine? In what ways do you see unforgiveness as being an especially great enemy to our faith and confidence in Christ?
Pray Back Time: (Pray what you've learned in your small group.) As you look over the list of "seeds of faith" plant one or more of those seeds through a specific prayer for an issue, need or even a person. The list includes seeds of joy (for depression), forgiveness (for hatred), humility (for pride), courage (for fear), assurance (for guilt), and confidence (for inferiority).
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
